

Guidelines for Attending Services at Central Church. We're so delighted that we're able to meet again in-person. Please note the following guidelines that will help keep everyone safe as we gather together on a Sunday. Please note that if you identify as a vulnerable person,* health authorities recommend avoiding contact or gathering with others. If you have experienced a fever, cough, sore throat, shortness of breath, or travelled overseas or visited a COVID hotspot in the past month, please stay home at this time. We look forward to joining with you in-person or online.

REGISTER

Register online at centralchurch.net.au/register or click the banner on our homepage

Register only for your nominated service that you're part of. Please do not register for multiple services.

If you're unable to attend a service one week, please join the livestream available from 9AM on Sundays

If you're not registered and come along, we are highly unlikely to be able to provide a place for you (because of capped numbers). We're sad that we cannot accommodate everyone at this time, but appreciate everyone's understanding as we work within the regulations required of us.

If on the day you are unable to attend, please contact registrations (register@centralchurch.net.au) so that someone else can attend.

PREPARE

Please wash your hands before arriving and make use of the sanitiser station at the entry point of the building.

Please arrive no earlier than 15 minutes before the service for check-in

Please park in the designated areas for your service. AM Auditorium services may use the South St carpark and the carparks accesible from Limestone St. Heritage building service may use the main carpark accessible from Gordon St. 5.30PM may use any carparks.

Bring along a water bottle if you would like to have access to water during the service (the water cooler and kitchen will not be accessible).

If you are unwell or displaying any flu-like symptoms (fever, cough, sore throat, shortness of breath), please stay at home.

If you have travelled overseas or to a COVID hotspot (in the past month), please stay at home.

ATTEND

When you arrive, a connect team member will check you in and direct you to an area to be seated.

Seating will be in household groups, socially distancing (1.5m, with 3 spare seats or a third of a pew) from others. The connect team will direct you to a section to be seated and remain (for the duration of the service).

If children are registered for child supervision, they will need to be checked-in with your family and remain with you until after the kid's talk. During the following song, kids may be taken to the foyer (for auditorium services) or courtyard (for the heritage building service) where they will be collected and taken to the hall or creche room. Kids will be brought back to the foyer/ courtyard during the final song.

LEAVE

At this stage people may mingle for a short time outside after the service, with fellow service attendees only. Then make your way to the carpark to head home.

At this stage there won't be any refreshments offered, so we'd recommend joining with other households (as is COVID safe for you) to share in a time of fellowship.

Cleaning will commence 5mins after the service end time in preparation for the next service - please bear this in mind and leave in a timely manner.

Catch up in Homegroups during the week to dig deeper and share in fellowship (where possible). If you would like to join a homegroup (in-person or by Zoom, depending upon the group), please visit our website for more information.

***Please note that vulnerable people include:** Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people 50 years and older, with one or more chronic conditions; People 65 years and older with chronic health conditions (specified by Department of Health); People 70 years and older; and People with compromised immune systems.
